

HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN OUR COMMUNITY

Florida is ranked third in the nation for reports of sex and labor trafficking. As a partner organization of the lead investigative team, the Palm Beach County Human Trafficking Task Force (PBHTTF), the Human Trafficking Coalition of the Palm Beaches (HTCPB) supports their accomplishments. Since 2017, PBHTTF has:

- · Received/investigated over 240 cases
- Identified and provided services to over 150 victims
- Arrested over 50 perpetrators of human trafficking-related crimes
- Convicted over 25 perpetrators of human trafficking-related crimes

POTENTIAL INDICATORS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

- A juvenile is engaged in commercial sex
- An individual is forced to perform sexual acts
- An individual is forced to pay off a debt
- An individual has been forced to accept employment at a job different from what they were told
- An individual feels pressured or threatened to stay at a job they want to leave
- An individual is isolated from friends or family or has limited access to those who may be able to help
